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Code of Ethics

WHEREAS, article 18 of the General Municipal Law prohibits the officers and employees of a municipality from having certain conflicts of interest, and

WHEREAS section 806 of the General Municipal Law requires the governing body of each county, city (other than the City of New York), town, village, school district and fire district¹ to adopt a code of ethics that sets forth for the guidance of its officers and employees standards of conduct reasonably expected of them, and

WHEREAS section 806 of the General Municipal Law also authorizes the governing body of any other municipality to adopt such a code of ethics, and

WHEREAS, a code of ethics adopted by the governing body of a municipality must set forth standards of conduct for the guidance of the officers and employees of the municipality with respect to disclosure of interests in legislation before the local governing body, holding of investments in conflict with official duties, private employment in conflict with official duties, future employment, and such other standards as may be deemed advisable.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Town Board of the Gaines New York hereby adopts a code of ethics to read as follows:

Code of Ethics of the Town of Gaines

Section 1. Purpose.

Officers and employees of the Town of Gaines hold their positions to serve and benefit the public, and not for obtaining unwarranted personal or private gain in the exercise and performance of their official powers and duties. The Gaines Town Board recognizes that, in furtherance of this fundamental principle, there is a need for clear and reasonable standards of ethical conduct. This code of ethics establishes those standards.

Section 2. Definitions.

(a) "Board" means the governing board of a municipality and any municipal administrative board (e.g. planning board, zoning of board of appeals), commission, or other agency or body comprised of two or more municipal officers or employees.

(b) "Code" means this code of ethics.

(c) "Interest" means a direct or indirect financial or material benefit, but does not include any benefit arising from the provision or receipt of any services generally available to the residents or taxpayers of the municipality or an area of the municipality, or a lawful class of such residents or taxpayers. A municipal officer or employee is deemed to have an interest in any private organization when he or she, his or her spouse, or a member of his or her household, is an owner, partner, member, director, officer, employee, or directly or indirectly owns or controls more than 5% of the organization's outstanding stock.

(d) "Municipality" means Town of Gaines. The word "municipal" refers to the municipality.

(e) "Municipal officer or employee" means a paid or unpaid officer or employee of the Town of Gaines including, but not limited to, the members of any municipal board.

(f) "Relative" means a spouse, parent, step-parent, sibling, step-sibling, sibling's spouse, child, step-child, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, first cousin, or household member of a municipal officer or employee, and individuals having any of these relationships to the spouse of the officer or employee.

Section 3. Applicability.

This code of ethics applies to the officers and employees of the Town of Gaines and shall supersede any prior municipal code of ethics. The provisions of this code of ethics shall apply in addition to all applicable State and local laws relating to conflicts of interest and ethics including, but not limited to, article 18 of the General Municipal Law and all rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the Town of Gaines.

Section 4. Prohibition on use of municipal position for personal or private gain.

No municipal officer or employee shall use his or her municipal position or official powers and duties to secure a financial or material benefit for himself or herself, a relative, or any private organization in which he or she is deemed to have an interest.

Section 5. Disclosure of interest in legislation and other matters.

(a) Whenever a matter requiring the exercise of discretion comes before a municipal officer or employee, either individually or as a member of a board, and disposition of the matter could result in a direct or indirect financial or material benefit to himself or herself, a relative, or any private organization in which he or she is deemed to have an interest, the municipal officer or employee shall disclose in writing the nature of the interest.

(b) The disclosure shall be made when the matter requiring disclosure first comes before the municipal officer or employee, or when the municipal officer or employee first acquires knowledge of the interest requiring disclosure, whichever is earlier.

(c) In the case of a person serving in an elective office, the disclosure shall be filed with the governing board of the municipality. In all other cases, the disclosure shall be filed with the person's supervisor or, if the person does not have a supervisor, the disclosure shall be filed with the municipal officer, employee or board having the power to appoint to the person's position. In addition, in the case of a person serving on a municipal board, a copy of the disclosure shall be filed with the board. Any disclosure made to a board shall be made publicly at a meeting of the board and must be included in the minutes of the meeting.

Section 6. Recusal and abstention.

(a) No municipal officer or employee may participate in any decision or take any official action with respect to any matter requiring the exercise of discretion, including discussing the matter and voting on it, when he or she knows or has reason to know that the action could confer a direct or indirect financial or material benefit on himself or herself, a relative, or any private organization in which he or she is deemed to have an interest.

(b) In the event that this section prohibits a municipal officer or employee from exercising or performing a power or duty:

(1) if the power or duty is vested in a municipal officer as a member of a board, then the power or duty shall be exercised or performed by the other members of the board; or

(2) if the power or duty that is vested in a municipal officer individually, then the power or duty shall be exercised or performed by his or her deputy or, if the officer does not have a deputy, the power or duty shall be performed by another person to whom the officer may lawfully delegate the function.

(3) if the power or duty is vested in a municipal employee, he or she must refer the matter to his or her immediate supervisor, and the immediate supervisor shall designate another person to exercise or perform the power or duty.

Section 7. Prohibition inapplicable; disclosure, recusal and abstention not required.

(a) This code's prohibition on use of a municipal position (section 4), disclosure requirements (section 5), and requirements relating to recusal and abstention (section 6), shall not apply with respect to the following matters:

(1) adoption of the municipality's annual budget;

(2) any matter requiring the exercise of discretion that directly affects any of the following groups of people or a lawful class of such groups:

(i) all municipal officers or employees;

(ii) all residents or taxpayers of the municipality or an area of the municipality; or

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(iii) the general public; or

(3) any matter that does not require the exercise of discretion.

(b) Recusal and abstention shall not be required with respect to any matter:

(1) which comes before a board when a majority of the board's total membership would otherwise be prohibited from acting by section 6 of this code;

(2) which comes before a municipal officer when the officer would be prohibited from acting by section 6 of this code and the matter cannot be lawfully delegated to another person.

Section 8. Investments in conflict with official duties.

(a) No municipal officer or employee may acquire the following investments:

(1) investments that can be reasonably expected to require more than sporadic recusal and abstention under section 6 of this code; or

(2) investments that would otherwise impair the person's independence of judgment in the exercise or performance of his or her official powers and duties.

(b) This section does not prohibit a municipal officer or employee from acquiring any other investments or the following assets:

(1) real property located within the municipality and used as his or her personal residence;

(2) less than five percent of the stock of a publicly traded corporation; or

(3) bonds or notes issued by the municipality and acquired more than one year after the date on which the bonds or notes were originally issued.

Section 9. Private employment in conflict with official duties.

No municipal officer or employee, during his or her tenure as a municipal officer or employee, may engage in any private employment, including the rendition of any business, commercial, professional or other types of services, when the employment:

(a) can be reasonably expected to require more than sporadic recusal and abstention pursuant to section 6 of this code;

(b) can be reasonably expected to require disclosure or use of confidential information gained by reason of serving as a municipal officer or employee;

(c) violates section 805-a(1)(c) or (d) of the General Municipal Law; or

(d) requires representation of a person or organization other than the municipality in connection with litigation, negotiations or any other matter to which the municipality is a party.

Section 10. Future employment.

(a) No municipal officer or employee may ask for, pursue or accept a private post-government employment opportunity with any person or organization that has a matter requiring the exercise of discretion pending before the municipal officer or employee, either individually or as a member of a board, while the matter is pending or within the 30 days following final disposition of the matter.

(b) No municipal officer or employee, for the two-year period after serving as a municipal officer or employee, may represent or render services to a private person or organization in connection with any matter involving the exercise of discretion before the municipal office, board, department or comparable organizational unit for which he or she serves.

(c) No municipal officer or employee, at any time after serving as a municipal officer or employee, may represent or render services to a private person or organization in connection with any particular transaction in which he or she personally and substantially participated while serving as a municipal officer or employee.

Section 11. Personal representations and claims permitted.

This code shall not be construed as prohibiting a municipal officer or employee from:

(a) representing himself or herself, or his or her spouse or minor children before the municipality; or

(b) asserting a claim against the municipality on his or her own behalf, or on behalf of his or her spouse or minor children.

Section 12. Use of municipal resources

(a) Municipal resources shall be used for lawful municipal purposes. Municipal resources include, but are not limited to, municipal personnel, and the municipality's money, vehicles, equipment, materials, supplies or other property.

(b) No municipal officer or employee may use or permit the use of municipal resources for personal or private purposes, but this provision shall not be construed as prohibiting:

(1) any use of municipal resources authorized by law or municipal policy;

(2) the use of municipal resources for personal or private purposes when provided to a municipal officer or employee as part of his or her compensation; or

(3) the occasional and incidental use during the business day of municipal telephones and computers for necessary personal matters such as family care and changes in work schedule.(c) No municipal officer or employee shall cause the municipality to spend more than is reasonably necessary for transportation, meals or lodging in connection with official travel.

Section 13. Interests in Contracts.

(a) No municipal officer or employee may have an interest in a contract that is prohibited by section 801 of the General Municipal Law.

(b) Every municipal officer and employee shall disclose interests in contracts with the municipality at the time and in the manner required by section 803 of the General Municipal Law.

Section 14. Nepotism.

Except as otherwise required by law:

(a) No municipal officer or employee, either individually or as a member of a board, may participate in any decision specifically to appoint, hire, promote, discipline or discharge a relative for any position at, for or within the municipality or a municipal board.

(b) No municipal officer or employee may supervise a relative in the performance of the relative's official powers or duties.

Section 15. Political Solicitations.

(a) No municipal officer or employee shall directly or indirectly to compel or induce a subordinate municipal officer or employee to make, or promise to make, any political contribution, whether by gift of money, service or other thing of value.

(b) No municipal officer or employee may act or decline to act in relation to appointing, hiring or promoting, discharging, disciplining, or in any manner changing the official rank, status or compensation of any municipal officer or employee, or an applicant for a position as a municipal officer or employee, or the basis of the giving or withholding or neglecting to make any contribution of money or service or any other valuable thing for any political purpose.

Section 16. Confidential Information.

No municipal officer or employee who acquires confidential information in the course of exercising or performing his or her official powers or duties may disclose or use such information unless the disclosure or use is required by law or in the course of exercising or performing his or her official powers and duties.

Section 17. Gifts.

(a) No municipal officer or employee shall solicit, accept or receive a gift in violation of section 805-a(1)(a) of the General Municipal Law as interpreted in this section.

(b) No municipal officer or employee may directly or indirectly solicit any gift.

(c) No municipal officer or employee may accept or receive any gift, or multiple gifts from the same donor, having an annual aggregate value of seventy-five dollars or more when:

(1) the gift reasonably appears to be intended to influence the officer or employee in the exercise or performance of his or her official powers or duties;

(2) the gift could reasonably be expected to influence the officer or employee in the exercise or performance of his or her official powers or duties; or

(3) the gift is intended as a reward for any official action on the part of the officer or employee.

(d) For purposes of this section, a "gift" includes anything of value, whether in the form of money, service, loan, travel, entertainment, hospitality, thing or promise, or in any other form. The value of a gift is the gift's fair market value, determined by the retail cost of the item or a comparable item. The fair market value of a ticket entitling the holder to food, refreshments, entertainment, or any other benefit is the face value of the ticket, or the actual cost to the donor, whichever is greater. Determination of whether multiple gifts from a single donor exceed seventy-five dollars must be made by adding together the value of all gifts received from the donor by an officer or employee during the twelve-month period preceding the receipt of the most recent gift.

(e) (1) A gift to a municipal officer or employee is presumed to be intended to influence the exercise or performance of his or her official powers or duties when the gift is from a private person or organization that seeks municipal action involving the exercise of discretion by or with the participation of the officer or employee.

(2) A gift to a municipal officer or employee is presumed to be intended as a reward for official action when the gift is from a private person or organization that has obtained municipal action involving the exercise of discretion by or with the participation of the officer or employee during the preceding twelve months.

(f) This section does not prohibit any other gift, including:

(1) gifts made to the municipality;

(2) gifts from a person with a family or personal relationship with the officer or employee when the circumstances make it clear that the personal relationship, rather than the recipient's status as a municipal officer or employee, is the primary motivating factor for the gift;

(3) gifts given on special occasions, such as marriage, illness, or retirement, which are modest, reasonable and customary;

(4) unsolicited advertising or promotional material of little intrinsic value, such as pens, pencils, note pads, and calendars;

(5) awards and plaques having a value of seventy-five dollars or less which are publicly presented in recognition of service as a municipal officer or employee, or other service to the community; or

(6) meals and refreshments provided when a municipal officer or employee is a speaker or participant at a job-related professional or educational conference or program and the meals and refreshments are made available to all participants.

Section 18. Board of Ethics.

(a) There is an Orleans County Board of Ethic established to be utilized by the townships if they prefer. The board of ethics consists of five members, who are not officers or employees of the municipality, but at least one of whom must be a municipal officer or employee.

(b) The board of ethics shall render advisory opinions to the officers and employees of the Town of Gaines with respect to article 18 of the General Municipal Law and this code. Such advisory opinions must be rendered pursuant to the written request of any such officer or employee under such rules and regulations as the board of ethics may prescribe. The board of ethics shall have the advice of legal counsel employed by the board, or if none, the municipality's legal counsel. In addition, the board of ethics may make recommendations with respect to the drafting and adoption of a code of ethics, or amendments thereto, upon the request of the Town of Gaines.

Section 19. Posting and distribution.

(a) The town of Gaines Supervisor must promptly cause a copy of this code, and a copy of any amendment to this code, to be posted publicly and conspicuously in each building under the municipality's control. The code must be posted within ten days following the date on which the code takes effect. An amendment to the code must be posted within ten days following the date on which the amendment takes effect.

(b) The town of Gaines Supervisor must promptly cause a copy of this code, including any amendments to the code, to be distributed to every person who is or becomes an officer and employee of the Town of Gaines.

(c) Every municipal officer or employee who receives a copy of this code or an amendment to the code must acknowledge such receipt in writing. Such acknowledgments must be filed with the Jean Klatt, Town Clerk who must maintain such acknowledgments as a public record.

(d) The failure to post this code or an amendment to the code does not affect either the applicability or enforceability of the code or the amendment. The failure of a municipal officer or employee to receive a copy of this code of ethics or an amendment to the code, or to acknowledge receipt thereof in writing, does not affect either the applicability or enforceability of the code.

Section 20. Enforcement.

Any municipal officer or employee who violates this code may be censured, fined, suspended or removed from office or employment in the manner provided by law.

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Section 21. Effective date.

This code takes effect on February 14, 2012

WHEREAS, the Town is an occasional issuer of tax-exempt obligations and thus is subject to the aforementioned compliance requirements which are critical for the preservation of preferential tax status of those obligations; and

WHEREAS, it is therefore in the best interest of the Town to adopt formal written procedures to ensure such compliance and to designate an official responsible for ensuring that such procedures are followed;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Town hereby adopts the interim post-issuance compliance procedures attached hereto as "Schedule A" and resolves to be governed thereby; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Schedule A

- a. <u>Purpose</u>: The purpose behind implementation of post-issuance compliance procedures is to ensure that the Town is compliant with federal tax law requirements related to its outstanding tax-exempt obligations for the life of the obligations.
- b. <u>Compliance Officer Designation, Education and Training</u>: The Town will designate a "Compliance Officer" who will be the primary official responsible for monitoring postissuance compliance with federal tax laws. The Compliance Officer will attend training and educational seminars at least annually at the law firm of Hodgson Russ and will consult with bond counsel as needed to keep current on IRS regulations and developments relating to post-issuance compliance for its obligations. The Town's designated Compliance Officer is Andrew W. Meier, Town Attorney.

- c. <u>Record Retention and Due Diligence Review</u>: The Compliance Officer is responsible for thorough record retention of all material documents relevant to the issuance of the Town's tax-exempt obligations including, but not limited to, the transcript of proceedings, closing binder, bond counsel opinion, tax certificate, IRS-required filings, records of investments and expenditures made with proceeds, documents pertaining to existing or potential private and public use of bond-financed property, etc. The Compliance Officer will conduct due diligence review of these documents both upon receipt and at regular intervals throughout the life of the obligation.
- d. <u>Monitoring Compliance</u>: Compliance Officer will monitor use of proceeds and arbitrage restrictions through implementation of accounting methods and consultation with bond counsel and a rebate consultant when necessary.
- e. <u>Correcting Potential Non-Compliance</u>: Upon discovery of potential or existing noncompliance with post-issuance <u>tax</u> laws, Compliance Officer will promptly take steps, including consultation with bond counsel, to correct such non-compliance.

Supervisor Culhane opened the public hearing at 7:32PM. The following residents addressed the board:

Gary Davy is concerned that there is not a member from the farming community on the ZBA. Will the local law be going to the County for review? He is concerned that only 5 community members will be making decisions and the work load could be large. **Lorraine Oakley** is this legal according to the County Charter? Is this being proposed because it is too much work for the town board and maybe the board thinks it was a mistake to dissolve the planning board and this is the remedy? How will due process be handled if there is no board to appeal too? She feels the ZBA will be the judge and jury. **Connie Mosher** is in favor of proceeding because zoning board is already in place. It is being done in other towns and is legal. It will streamline and consolidate things. **Lorraine Oakley** What towns have done this?

Andrew Meier, Town Attorney addressed the questions. The County doesn't have jurisdiction over the town in this matter. He explained that the ZBA handles issues from the Code Officer and that if someone doesn't agree with the findings of a site plan review or a special use permit the residents recourse is to fill an article 78. He stated that several towns in Central NY have give these 2 duties to the ZBA.

Lorraine Oakley feels the ZBA is too inexperienced to take on the extra duties and the same people are on the Comprehensive Plan Committee. She thinks the residents are losing their rights.

Dave Allchin stated that in the past he felt that it was the same people doing everything so he doesn't see the difference now.

John Mosher this appears to be consolidation and very efficient. He feels the old planning board had plenty of time to implement their plan and the ZBA should have the same courtesy. He feels new ideas and new people are a good thing.

Lorraine Oakley 1 person filing an Article 78 would eat up any savings the consolidation creates.

Henry Smith Jr. What is the advantage of no planning board if the ZBA is going to take over the duties?

Andrew Meier responded that this is not a public hearing to about abolishing the planning board. That was done in January 2012. This public hearing is to transfer the duties of special use permit and site plan review from the town board to the ZBA. **Marilynn Miller** said she has attended most planning and town board meetings for the past 4 to 5 years and the planning board used to meet monthly sometimes for only 20 minutes. This was costly to the taxpayer. Since January there have been very few issues and no need for a meeting. She feels the old board would have met anyway wasting taxpayers' dollars.

Lorraine Oakley stated in all fairness there were a lot of big issues to deal with last year and this year has been quiet.

Ed Stueber likes the idea because of the bad economy and he thinks it will lower his taxes.

Connie Mosher doesn't understand why the ZBA taking on additional duties is taking away residents rights? She thinks we should go ahead with the idea.

Marilynn Miller thinks if residents want to exercise their rights they should come to meeting, but few people do.

Lorienda Smith said she has been coming to meetings for many years and most of the time she was the only resident present.

Lorraine Oakley again asked if we were not losing our right s to appeal. The attorney responded no.

Lorienda Smith asked if the Code Officer was still Ron Ebbs.

Mike Grabowski clarified that ZBA reviews issues from code enforcement and a negative site plan review or special use permit would be handled by the resident filing an Article 78.

With no further from the public the public hearing closed at 7:59 PM.

- Section 3. Pursuant to subdivision 2 of section 274-b of the Town Law of the State of New York, the Town Board of the Town of Gaines hereby authorizes the Zoning Board of Appeals to grant special use permits as set forth in the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Gaines.

The Gaines Town Board, by resolution adopted on September 22, 2009, authorized the establishment of Gaines Water District No. 10 pursuant to the provisions of Article 12 of the Town Law and by resolution adopted on November 10,2009, authorized the revised method of financing

The proposed project provided for the construction of a water supply system for Gaines Water. District No. 10, consisting of installation of water supply mains, hydrants, gate values, individual water services and appurtenances along portions of Sawyer Road, Kent Road, Transit Road and Densmore Road in the Town of Gaines. The exact boundaries of the water district were set forth in detail in the aforementioned resolutions.

The *initial* total projected cost of the project as set forth in the map, plan and report dated March 19,2009 attached to the Petition was not to exceed \$841,000.00, with \$630,726.00 of such amount to be paid from grant funds applied for solely in the name of the Town of Gaines through USDA, Rural Development, with the local share in the amount of \$210,242.00 to be financed in the form of loan assistance from USDA, Rural Development to the Town of Gaines. It was anticipated that the local share would be repaid over a period not to exceed thirty eight (38) years at an interest rate not to exceed 3.125% per annum, with a projected annual debt service payment of approximately

\$297.81 per parcel. Revenues necessary to be raised and applied to the annual debt payment would be levied and collected against those parcels within proposed Gaines Water District No. 10 on a benefit basis as determined by a benefit formula, and not on an ad valorem basis.

Upon subsequent review of the Town's application for project funding, USDA, Rural Development, issued a letter of Pre-Eligibility Determination on June 19, 2009, setting forth an estimated funding proposal of grant funds in the amount of \$613,000.00 and loan funds in the amount of \$228,000.00 for the project. The loan funds are to be repaid at a rate of interest of 2.75% per annum over a period not to exceed 38 years. Based upon the Pre-Eligibility Determination, the anticipated grant funds for the project decreased by \$17,728.00, the loan funds increased by a like amount, and the annual interest rate decreased by .375%. The result was an overall increase in the debt service charged per bond repayment unit from \$297.81 to \$304.58. The revised method of financing the project is set forth in a revised map, plan and report on file in the Gaines Town Clerk's Office dated September 23, 2009.

Upon further review and consideration of the application of the Town of Gaines for funding for such project, USDA, Rural Development, issued its final Letter of Conditions on March 31, 2011, approving grant funds from Rural Utilities Service (RUS) in the amount of\$599,000.00 and RUS loan funds in the amount of\$242,000.00 for the project. The revised method of financing, as set forth in the Letter of Conditions, provided for the grant funds being reduced by \$14,000.00, the loan funds increased by a like amount, and the annual interest rate being reduced by .25% to 2.5% per annum over the 38 year repayment term. The result was an overall increase in the debt service charged per bond repayment unit from \$304.58 to \$310.59. The revised method of financing the project is set forth in a revised map, plan and report dated November 30, 2011.

Dear Lorraine:

I am hereby responding to your inquiry to our office as to whether text amendments to the Town of Gaines Zoning Ordinance reassigning various administrative functions hitherto performed by the Town of Gaines Planning Board to the Town of Gaines Zoning Board of Appeals need to be submitted to the Orleans County Planning Board (CPB) prior to their adoption by the Gaines Town Council.

Upon review of the amendments, it is the Department of Planning and Development's position that they indeed require submittal to the CPB pursuant to § 239-m of General Municipal Law. In particular, § 239-m.3(a)(ii) explicitly references "adoption or amendment of a zoning ordinance or local law." And since the amendments apply to the entire municipality – including those areas within 500 ft. of a municipal boundary, as well as state and county highways as described in § 239-m.3(b) of General Municipal Law – referral to the CPB is mandatory.

Please be advised that this is a staff opinion that should not be interpreted as legal advice. For your information, I provided a copy of the amendments to Natasha E. Phillip at Counsel's Office at the New York State Department of State and posed the same question to her. Ms. Phillip is an attorney with a concentration in environmental law who routinely provides informal assistance to local government officials throughout the State as part of her job responsibilities. She frequently is a presenter on a variety of planning topics at local government workshops. She was in our region most recently this past spring in Pittsford, where one of her lecture sessions was titled "Adopting and Amending Zoning". Ms. Phillip concurred that the amendments should be referred to the CPB.

At the Public Hearing meeting on August 14th in the Gaines Town Hall, the Town of Gaines Board passed a local law delegating Zoning & Planning functions to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Please see attached response to my inquiry made to the Orleans County Planning Board.

This proposal indeed, should have been submitted to the Orleans County Planning Board for its review and recommendation prior to its adoption. Due to the question of its legality, this puts any decision made by the Zoning Board of Appeals in jeopardy and could open up a "Pandora's Box" of legal headaches and undue expense for the residents of the Town of Gaines.

In order to avoid any further action, I am requesting that this matter be corrected at the next Town of Gaines Board Meeting on September 11, 2012.

Supervisor Culhane asked that the members stand, state their name, address their comments to the board and limit their comments to five minutes.

Lorraine read a letter and asked that it be entered into the record.

I would like the Supervisor or the Board to explain why the Gaines Supervisors salary is budgeted for an Approx. 13%, (\$650) increase from \$5,500 to \$6,250, while the Town Clerks and Highway Superintendents salaries are budgeted for 2%, and the Town Council for no increase. In comparison, the Town of Albion Supervisor is budgeted for a \$200 increase, (a little over 2%) which will bring him up to our Supervisors current salary of \$5,500.

In addition, the Budget officers title has been taken back by our Supervisor, giving her a pay raise of another approx. \$1,500. The Town of Albion budget officer Tom Baldwin, receives \$1,000.

Plus, I believe mileage is now being charged by the Supervisor, where I do not believe it has in the past. Even though this might be acceptable, it certainly is an additional benefit.

I have always been of the feeling a good part of these part time jobs is Service to the Community, with great satisfaction, but little monetary reward and that the Supervisor should set precedent. In the past the Supervisors and Board have taken decreases in pay to set this precedent. Next year the Union contract is up for renegotiation. This percent of increase will almost certainly come back to haunt the town.

I would like the board polled to see if every board member is in favor of this increase. I also ask to have this letter, plus the response of each board member be entered into the minutes.

Dave Allchin asked how a union contract can be written referring to 2union/2 nonunion employees when the 2 nonunion employees are elected officials not union members.

Lorrienda Smith asked about several line items in the budget.

Ed Stuber asked Clerk Klatt if the taxes were going up or down with the preliminary budget. She replied they were even.

Dave Allchin asked how the large medical stipend came about. He feels that amount is unheard of.

MaryJo Syck stated that the County pays a stipend of \$2000.00 to \$2500.00/year in lieu of medical. She recommends we match the county.

David Heminway said the thruway pays \$3000.00 for a \$14,000.00 policy. Supervisor is 2nd lowest paid salary in Orleans County. He asked how truck is being paid for.

Supervisor Culhane responded that the truck is paid for and will not be bonded.

Dan Geiger asked when the town had been audited . Clerk Klatt replied 2007 & 2008 for the court and other town entities by the state and independent auditors, but every year our accounting firm audits the town and submits a report to the state comptroller.

Lorraine Oakley again asked that her letter be addressed and that her request for a poll on the Supervisor's 13% increase be addressed. The poll was taken. Councilperson Kirby - opposed - it would set a precedent before union negotiations begin next year. Councilperson Kast - strongly opposed - agrees with Councilman Kirby. Councilperson Syck - although he first agreed he now is opposed and feels the position should set an example. Smith-opposed- although she first agreed, listening to the public comments she now feels the salary should remain \$5,500.00. Supervisor Culhane - opposed- She came prepared to read a statement later in the evening stating that she would be changing her salary back to \$5,500.00.

MaryJo Syck asked why the Town Clerk and Highway Superintendent received a 4 % increase in 2012. David Kast replied that they received only a 2% but if a new water district or extra duties had been added that would have increased their salary.

David Heminway stated that total salaries should be posted for transparency.

Connie Mosher feels the Supervisor's salary should be higher.

......

Lorraine Oakley stated that originally in the tentative budget the supervisor's increase was 35% then was reduced to a 13% request and that she appreciates the supervisor agreeing to keep the salary the same.

Councilman Syck said he feels the Supervisor easily does twice as much work as a Councilperson and he would agree to give up half of his salary to the Supervisor.

Lorraine Oakley stated that the Supervisor should delegate some of her duties to the Councilman to ease her burden and not carry the full load.

Pam Lusk said that we should not be talking about a \$750.00 increase for the Supervisor we should be talking about the health care stipend.

Lorraine Oakley said it's not the \$750.00 it's the 13% increase it represents. Supervisor Culhane stated that she is here to help the town not rule. She wants to improve the town. She said she is not a politician, she is an artist.

Marilynn Miller she appreciates that the supervisor brings knowledge to the community and saves them tax dollars. She also asked that her written questions be entered into the record .Marilynn then submitted the following questions for the record. Some were answered throughout the meeting.

Questions for Public Hearing of Oct.23, 2012/ Budget Hearing:

How is the new town truck being paid for (\$230,000)?

What are the Interfund Transfers, and how do you track what specifically is being transferred to and from (Revenues and Appropriations)?

What has been the reason for the doubling of the State Retirement from 2010 to the present?

When salaries are posted prior to the Budget Hearing, why isn't the total salary posted, rather than just the base salary? (For instance: the additional Administrative earning paid to each administrator for each Water District does not figure into the salaries posted, nor is it mentioned anywhere in the posting.)

Why is the Bond Interest so high? (Item "A9010.6 BOND Principal" \$11,000 and Item "A9010.7 BOND Interest" \$3,422)? What was the original amount of the Bond?

What is the \$20,000 Garage Contractual for?

Dave Allchin commented that he thinks the healthcare stipend is too high. The Town of Murray employees receive \$5000.00 per year.

Butch Radzinski stated that the town is saving a minimum of \$20,000.00 by paying the stipend in lieu of healthcare. He sees it as a win/win situation.

Ed Stuber said he knows he is off the topic a little but said he doesn't feel the cost of being connected to water is made clear when a proposed water line is first being discussed. He thinks that the water districts would be more profitable if the more residents could afford to hook up.

Mike Grabowski commented that it is the boards job to be fiscally responsible and he would appreciate it if the town would lower his taxes.

Highway Superintendent said he would have no problem with his entire salary being posted at the town hall.
