**RESOLUTION NO. 82 - 0818
MAKING MODIFICATIONS TO THE 2018 BUDGET RELATING TO CHIPS HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT
REIMBURSEMENT**

Moved by Councilperson Neilans and seconded by Councilperson Kirby to make the following modifications to the 2018 budget due to an increase in funding from the CHIPS program, as follows:

- Increase Revenue DB3501 CHIPS from \$45,000 to \$65,863.33
- Increase Appropriation DB5112.2 CHIPS from \$40,000 to \$65,863.33
- Increase Revenue DB599 - Appropriated Fund Balance from \$15,056.33 to \$20,056.33

Discussion: Budget adjustments were recommended by the Town Bookkeeper to correct the \$5,000 error to balance the fund; and to account for the increased CHIPS revenue received and spent in 2018

RESOLUTION REQUESTING NYSDOT TO REVIEW THE SPEED LIMIT ON BUTTS ROAD

Resolution Defeated: Councilperson Kirby - Aye

Discussion: The Village of Albion was seeking the Town of Gaines assistance asking the NYSDOT to review the various speed limits on Butts Road because of the three entities are involved, the Village of Albion, the Town of Albion and the Town of Gaines. Councilperson Allport asked why and who makes the final determination. The decision is made by NYSDOT.

RESOLUTION NO. 84 - 0818

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING TOWN-WIDE REASSESSMENT IN 2019

Moved by Councilperson Allport and seconded by Councilperson Neilans, the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Section 305 of the New York State Real Property Tax law mandates uniform and equitable assessments; and

WHEREAS, computer-assisted mass appraisal systems, technical advice and financial assistance are available by cooperative agreement with the New York State Office of Real Property and the Orleans County Real Property Tax Service; and

WHEREAS, the last town-wide reassessment of real property took place in 2016.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Gaines Town Board as follows:

- 1) That the Assessor of the Town of Gaines is hereby authorized to undertake and implement a reassessment of the 2019 assessment roll.
- 2) That the Town Board does hereby agree, in conjunction with the New York State Real Property Services and the County of Orleans Real Property Tax Service to support the Town Assessment staff in this reassessment.
- 3) That the Town Board and Assessor are authorized to enter into any necessary agreements to achieve this purpose. Any agreement with a private contractor to provide services for the reassessment shall entered into only upon review of the Town Supervisor and the Assessor. The Gaines Town Board shall approve said agreements that result in an expenditure.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Doug Farley, Cobblestone Museum Director, spoke on behalf of the members of the Cobblestone Society. The membership does not support the building of a Dollar General store in Historical Cobblestone District. He read various sections in its entirety from the Town of Gaines Zoning Ordinance.

Section 521 - Purpose. The purpose of the CH District is to preserve certain areas of historical or cultural significance...It is the intention of this district to restrict further commercial development unless it is consistent with the architectural, cultural and historical character of the area...

Section 523 (c) The Town ZBA Site Plan Review must establish compliance with the following additional requirements; Sub-section (2) The proposed building or use does not encroach upon, diminish or otherwise adversely impact upon other structures.

He mentioned the various agencies who support the Cobblestone Society; including the Town Historian, the County Historian, all Historians in Orleans County, the NYS Parks and Historical Preservation; as well as the National Register of Historic Places.

In 1993, the Cobblestone School House was named as a National Historic Landmark; this designation is one of only 262 in the entire State of New York.

The Cobblestone Society questions why the Dollar General isn't looking at alternative locations? Why was the location changed from Route 98?

He attended the ZBA meeting last week, and said the ZBA is not acting properly; not letting Cobblestone or community members speak; misinformation; the claim there is "no formal" application, yet a SEQR review has been conducted; the failure to recognize the National significance of the Cobblestone district; the opinion seems to be "you're out of luck".

Mr. Farley ended his presentation with a picture of what school students sitting at the desks in the Cobblestone School would see looking out the window, the big yellow Dollar General store logo.

John "Jack" Mack asked to speak. He wanted to know who is in charge of Route 279, north of the Ridge Road. He said it's been resurfaced and needs to have lines drawn for no passing and passing zones. He was advised that particular section of Rt. 279 is a County road.

Mr. Mack addressed a recent anonymous letter his son received in the mail. His son is serving his country as an Airborne Ranger, and he told his father to open the letter. Mr. Mack's advice is: If you want to write a letter claiming things you know nothing about, misleading and lying to people, sign your name, be an adult. The audience applauded.

Bruce Kirby asked if the Zoning Board of Appeals would work on the Solar Farms section of the Zoning Ordinance. We could lose a huge solar project if it takes one or two years to complete the Zoning Ordinance updates. Supervisor Grube said he will discuss with LaBella, who would be able to write up the Solar section, and hopefully be completed within 2 or 3 months.

C. W. Lattin spoke on behalf of the Cobblestone Museum. He is asking the Town Board to place a one year moratorium on building in the Historical District.
